U.S. Fleet Forces Command

- "Ready Fleet" - ensures naval forces are manned, trained, and equipped now and in the future to meet Navy mission requirements, and to respond quickly to meet maritime homeland defense and disaster relief operations.
- "Global Reach" - provides combat-ready forces worldwide to carry out operations spanning the breadth of Navy capabilities.



Naval Air Systems Command
